Local Salmon Fishing Restrictions

To allow stock recovery in Drumcliffe River and Glencar Lake, Inland Fisheries Ireland have restricted the number of salmon (and sea trout >40cm) that can be fished in 2011.

All salmon and sea trout >40cm must be tagged on landing with both brown and blue gill tags. Without a brown tag specific for the Drumcliffe/Glencar system, anglers must release such fish immediately to the water.
